SUMMARY

The Executive Director is responsible to the Board of Library Trustees for the operation and management of library services, departments, programs, buildings, employment, supervision, training, discipline, and termination of employees; fiscal management of all services; and development and maintenance of the collection. This role also serves as the primary communicator and liaison, maintaining open, transparent communication with the Board, library staff, patrons, and broader community stakeholders.

The ideal candidate will proactively cultivate strategic partnerships, lead fundraising initiatives including grant applications, and effectively oversee facility management to provide safe, welcoming, and functional library environments. They will champion equity, diversity, and inclusion throughout the organization, ensuring the library remains responsive and reflective of community needs.

Additionally, the Executive Director will demonstrate exceptional leadership, fostering staff development and engagement through effective delegation, clear communication, and collaborative problem-solving. The candidate will actively monitor emerging trends and technologies, positioning the library to successfully adapt and innovate in service delivery, maintaining the highest standards of ethics, intellectual freedom, and patron-focused customer service.

RESPONSIBILITIES AND EXPECTATIONS

Leadership and management

- Provides strategic direction, coaching, and performance management to staff, aligning individual efforts with organizational goals.
- Oversees the selection, implementation, and training related to essential library technologies to enhance operational efficiency.

Community Engagement

- Maintains active visibility within the library and broader community, ensuring consistent and open communication.
- Represents the library positively, demonstrating welcoming and helpful behavior in all interactions.

Fiscal Operations

- Collaborates closely with the Fiscal Officer to develop and manage the library's annual budget effectively.
- Implements strategic fundraising initiatives, including levy campaigns, grants, and donor engagement to secure additional funding.

Organizational Partnerships

- Cultivates relationships with local organizations, educational institutions, and government agencies to expand library services and community impact.
- Actively participates in strategic collaboration to leverage resources, enhancing visibility and support for the library's mission.

Personnel Management

- Supervises direct reports across various departments, fostering professional growth and addressing staff well-being proactively.
- Collaborates with the Staff Association to ensure a supportive, inclusive, and secure workplace environment.

Policies and Procedures

- Partners with the Board of Trustees to develop and implement library policies, strategic initiatives, and core organizational values.
- Ensures ongoing compliance with applicable local, state, and federal laws, providing staff training to uphold standards.

Project Management

- Defines clear objectives, allocates resources, and manages timelines effectively to deliver library projects successfully.
- Coordinates internal teams, monitors risks, and evaluates outcomes to ensure projects align with strategic organizational goals.



EDUCATION AND EXPERIENCE

- A Master's degree is required. A Master of Library and Information Science [MLIS] is preferred.
- Ten or more years of progressively responsible library experience, including at least seven years of supervisory experience, is required.
- Experience in community engagement, collaboration, and advocacy li.e., working and partnering closely with civic/community partners, local businesses, government officials, and other key stakeholders] is required.
- Experience leading new projects and diverse teams to enhance collections, programs, services, facilities, and staff is required.
- Experience managing multiple work locations and a distributed workforce is required.
- Ability to effectively advocate for the library's land shared community] values including equity, diversity, intellectual freedom, sustainability, and innovation is required.
- Experience providing strategic financial oversight and managing budgets in alignment with organizational goals is preferred.

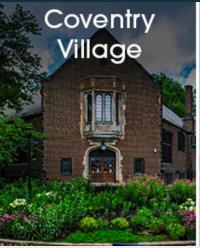
Investing in Innovation, Enriching Community

For over six decades, we've partnered with Heights Libraries to fund meaningful projects and resources that serve patrons of all ages. Our annual grants help maintain and improve library facilities, while also launching innovative new programs that make a lasting impact.

In the 2022–2023 fiscal year alone, Friends of Heights Library contributed more than \$72,000 in grants. In recent years, our support has averaged around \$40,000 annually—directly benefiting library users and strengthening our shared community.

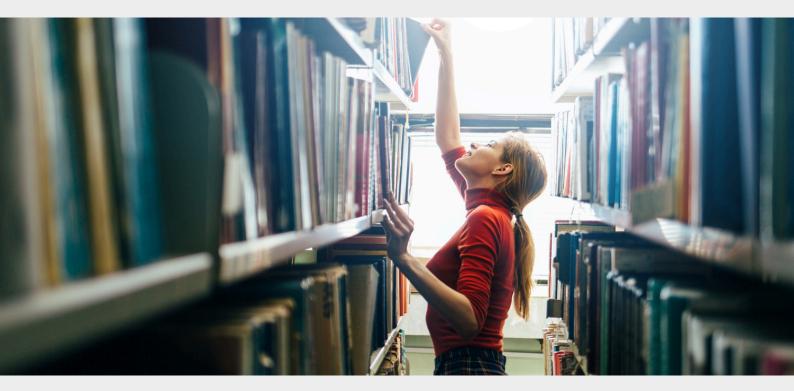
